Juvenile Delinquency Some of the Causes:

Jan Tennyson interviewed 8 young men between the ages of 15 and 18 who were temporarily living in a detention center. The boys were asked why they dropped out of school. All of them had similar stories. Here are their answers:

- No Dad at home
- Mom has 2 jobs
- No food on the table
- Sell drugs to provide needs
- Parents unavailable
- No Spiritual foundation
- Lack of guidance and encouragement
- Get Arrested
- Hopelessness

A Note from our Founder Thank you for helping me serve the children

I am blessed to have had the opportunity to serve the needs of destitute children and youth for over thirteen years in this ministry. I thank God for using you and so many others who make it all possible through your prayers, your time, and your financial support.

In an article in the *Dallas Morning News*, Mike Griffiths, general services director of the Marzelle C. Hill Transition Center (formerly Dallas County Emergency Shelter) is quoted as saying "the lengthy relationship between this facility and Dare to Dream speaks for itself.

They bring unconditional love and support to our kids. That's something these kids are dearly in need of.

The fact that the volunteers come back week after week touches these young people a lot." Mr. Griffiths said the program not only has an effect on the youth it serves but also shows outside community support for a troubled population that is often overlooked.

"Overlooked" is a word that is unappealing in every arena. In healthy families, children who are treated better than another causes friction in the family. How much more is the friction in the lives of young people who have their dad's in prison, the mom's on drugs, and stepparents who are abusing them. What about the abandoned children, who have no relatives to love, encourage, guide or provide a place to live once they leave an orphanage? Who will educate them in the way they should go?

This last year, my vision has been to "Strengthen our chords and expand our territory." I believe that is a call of God to do more than we have ever done to help children wherever we are invited to serve.



These students have been orphans since they were infants. A door opened in Romania through HUG Internationally for me to minister to these young men. When I asked if any of the students knew where they were going to live after they graduated, only one raised his hand. They are young men who can do great things with support and direction. Our help is needed. My heart says do what you can and pray. Thank you for helping me help the children. God bless you.
