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Founder, Jan Tennyson presented 2007 Governor's Lonestar Achievement Award in Austin Texas



Every year, The Governor's Volunteer Awards are presented to Texans who devote their time and talents to serving others. The Governor's Lonestar Achievement Award recognizes the outstanding service of an individual who has impacted the delivery of social services in Texas. Lonestar achievers have a minimum of 15 years of servicing and engaging others, and are those rare individuals who see impossible dreams and make them realities.

Tennyson, founder of Dare to Dream Children's Foundation, who grew up in the New York foster care system, has provided enrichment programs to over 20,000 abused neglected and foster children temporarily living in group homes, youth shelters, and detention facilities in Texas, as well as orphanages overseas.

Dare to Dream started on a card table in Tennyson's bedroom in Dallas, Texas in 1987, and this year marks a great milestone for Tennyson as she celebrates 20 years of service. Jan is a philanthropist and humanitarian. She collaborates with youth-serving agencies throughout the state of Texas. Most youth she serves are from single-family homes and are fatherless or orphans.

HERE ARE THE FACTS

Most young people who grow up in the United States will "make it". They will reach adulthood healthy, prepared for work, and able to contribute to the well being of their families and communities. Unfortunately, some will not.

Among those at greatest risk are the more than half-million youth who live outside their birth families in foster families, group homes, and institutions

Studies of youth aging out of foster care indicate that:

- 25% will have experienced homelessness at least once
- 46% will still lack a high school diploma four years after leaving care
- Only 38% will be employed two years after leaving care; fewer than 50% will have ever held a full-time job four years after leaving care
- More than a third suffer emotional disturbances and the behavioral problems that often accompany them
- 50% report having used illegal drugs; 25% report encounters with the criminal justice system, in many cases problems are related to alcohol and drug use
- Within two years 40-60% of the young women and 25% of the young men will have a child
- Fewer than one in five will be completely self-supporting four years after leaving the child welfare system

Why Help Castaway Children?

They live in America and deserve a chance to be successful regardless of their broken families.

Their risk is greatest; their hardship is most profound; and their current and future costs to our communities are the most significant

Broken promises, fractured families and broken dreams lead youth to a life in detention and eventually prison

1,000 unwed teenage girls become mothers

4,000 teenagers contract sexually transmitted diseases

EACH DAY - six teens find life hopeless enough to take their lives.
